

Exercise 10:

You will read a dialog with your partner. But you will see only your part of the dialog. Listen to your partner and choose which sentences to say.

For example . . .

Student A sees this part of the dialog:



Student A will start.

Student B sees this part of the dialog:



Student B responds.

1. Hello.	2. • Today is Tuesday • Hi. How are you?
3. • Fine, thank you. And you? • This is my pen.	4. • My name is Bob. • I'm fine, too. Thanks.

Exercise 11:

Student A

Step 1: Read line 1. Student B will choose a response and read it. Then you choose a response and read it, etc. Do not look at your partner's page.

1. You look happy today.
3. • I see. How old is it? • Great! When are you going?
5. • Wonderful! When is your wedding? • Wonderful! Who are you going with?
7. • No, I can't go on vacation because I have to work. • Terrific! I like pizza, too.

Step 2: Student B will start. Then you choose and read a response, etc. Do not look at your partner's page.

2. • Yes, I've been very busy at work. • Yes, my eyes are very good.
4. • I usually take my lunch to work. • I do child care.
6. • Wonderful! You can help me. • They're between three and four years old. What kind of work do you do?
8. • That's nice. • I usually take the bus.

Step 3: Change parts with your partner. You will be Student B and do Ex. 11 again.

Step 4: While you wait for your classmates to finish, you can . . .

- talk to your partner about any topic that you want.
 - ask your partner these questions and have a conversation with them.
1. Where do you like to go for vacation?

Exercise 11 *continued*:

Student B

Step 1: Student A will start. Then you choose and read a response, etc. Do not look at your partner's page.

2. • Yes, I feel sick. • Yes, I'm going to California.
4. • On an airplane. • Next week.
6. • My sister. Are you planning a vacation? • About \$2000.
8. • I see. • Great! Maybe I'll meet you in California.

1. Hi, Lee. I haven't seen you in a long time.
3. • I see. How old is it? • Oh, yeah? What type of work do you do?
5. • All right. That sounds like a good idea. • I see. How old are the children?
7. • I work in an office. • I like children, too.
